How long is my membership valid?

Guidance for completing the LPUK Membership form

What is the cost of LPUK membership?

Little People UK currently has a standard price of £10 per person, for both new membership and membership renewal.

How do I complete the membership?

You can complete the LPUK Membership Form online. Remember to complete the LPUK Membership for everyone who would like to be an LPUK Member.

What are the benefits of becoming and LPUK member?

- You will receive a quarterly newsletter
- You will receive all of LPUK's email updates
- You will be able to attend LPUK events
- You will have voting rights at the AGM

What are the different types of membership?

Individual (full) membership

- A person over the age of 18 who has dwarfism
- A full member is entitled to election on to the LPUK committee
- A full member may attend General Meetings and is entitled to vote

Individual (youth) membership

- A child who has dwarfism up to the age of 18
- Once a youth member reaches the age of 18, they can apply for an individual (full) membership
- A youth member may attend meetings, but may not vote. A dispensation may be given by the committee allowing youth members aged 12 or over to vote on issues that relate to them (for example, the election of Youth Representative)

Associate membership

- This includes:
 - Parents/guardians
 - Siblings
 - Grandparents
 - Spouse
 - Extended family and friends

of a person with dwarfism.

- Associate members are entitled for election on to the LPUK committee, but must be nominated by a current full member.
- All may attend General Meetings, but may not vote unless they qualify (i.e. voting on behalf of member under 18).

Organisation membership

- Individuals and organisations whose experience or specialist knowledge would make a positive contribution to the CIO.
- An Organisation member must be nominated by a current full member
- An Organisation member may attend General Meetings, but are not entitled to vote at a general meeting.
